Dear Parents / Guardians,

At this stage of the new year we are well and truly back into the routine of school after the Christmas break. Thanks to the staff, parents and children who worked hard during the month of December to support the wide range of activities going on in the school and the wider community. The varied Christmas Plays/Pageants and concerts were greatly appreciated by the captive audiences and it was nice to welcome many visitors to the school over the festive period. The cold weather was challenge to us all on our return to school last week and it was a great team effort to ensure the school was open and ready to receive the children at the usual times. It was also nice to take many of our students to the church to celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany with Fr. Paul and Fr. John last Monday and we are now looking forward to Catholic Schools Week which takes place on the 20-24th January. This week of events is closely followed by the Sacrament of Confirmation for pupils in our sixth classes on Friday 31st January at 2pm. I would like to take this opportunity to send our best wishes to all who are making their Confirmation and I hope they enjoy the celebrations. The schools ethos very much centres on charity and good deeds and our focus this Winter centred on funding for a school in Zambia for basic necessities as well as Childline and local charities, namely the St Vincent De Paul, Meals on Wheels. We are also allocating some funding to Myanmar, which is mired in crisis at the moment- a conflict that is not receiving that much attention in the media. Over 50,000 people have been displaced, homeless from the main town in the Diocese of Banmaw. The local church is trying to provide them with emergency humanitarian relief medical assistance (often just basic first aid), shelter (tents in open fields) and a generator. Thank you to your all for your generosity over the Christmas period and particularly Thanks to the Parents Association who were very busy organising Activities In December. We will have another policy review meeting in January when we will establish a focus group on anti-bullying.

CAR PARKING

There are simple little practices that we can incorporate into our daily lives that can make a difference globally. Small, consistent changes lead to meaningful results over time. Which of the following ideas resonate most with you? Perhaps you can choose one or two that you are not doing already.

At Home

1. Energy Efficiency

- Use energy-efficient LED bulbs.
- Turn off lights and electronics when not in use.
- Install a programmable thermostat to reduce heating and cooling energy.

2. Reduce Water Usage

- Fix leaks promptly.
- Install low-flow showerheads and faucets.
- Collect rainwater for gardening.

3. Waste Reduction

- Compost food scraps.
- Practise recycling, reusing and upcycling.
- Switch to reusable items (e.g., cloth bags, glass jars, and beeswax wraps).

4. Eco-Friendly Cleaning

- Use natural cleaning agents like vinegar, baking soda, and lemon.
- Avoid single-use cleaning wipes.

1. Plant-Based Meals

- o Incorporate more plant-based meals into your diet.
- Support local and organic produce.

2. Reduce Food Waste

- Plan meals to minimize waste.
- Store leftovers properly to prevent spoilage.

Shopping Habits




- Buy durable and high-quality products to reduce frequent replacements.
