A sensory garden with a variety of textures provides numerous benefits for children with autism. Different surfaces, such as soft grass, smooth stones, rough bark, and squishy sand, offer rich tactile experiences that help children explore and process sensory input in a safe and enjoyable way.

Exploring different textures also improves fine and gross motor skills, as children touch, squeeze, and walk on various surfaces. Additionally, engaging with textures encourages curiosity, focus, and confidence, helping children become more comfortable with new sensations in everyday life.

By creating a well-designed sensory garden, children with autism can develop sensory tolerance, reduce anxiety, and experience joy through nature-based play. This is a very significant area in our school and please ask to visit if you are in the school.




