Throughout the past year we have been developing our sensory room and sensory garden so that we can provide the best possible facilities. Thank you to Trim Credit union for their donation of €500 Euro towards our facilities recently. We hope to have a big opening day next term but for now €2 or any donation is greatly appreciated.

Sr Mac loved her students and so many of them returned to enjoy her wit and recall days they spent together solving difficult maths problems. She developed great relationships with her teaching colleagues and their families, many of whom have remained lifelong friends.
