Christmas Plays: Already I see some preparations underway for Christmas activities. It is hard to believe that we are at this stage of the year again. There is, I suppose a little more poignancy in the fact that this is our last Christmas as St. Mary's, where so many celebrations have happened over the years.

Photos and Social Media: Please bear in mind that during Christmas plays and concerts that photographs are usually taken, but we remind parents that they should under no circumstances upload pictures of other children, other than their own to social media.

Child Protection Policy: The Board of Management of St. Mary's has a comprehensive child protection policy in place. The Deputy Principal Ms. Nally is the designated Liaison person and Ms. O' Brien is the Deputy Designated Liaison person. It was great to get help for the coming year. At this meeting we heard from our education welfare officers who stressed the importance of attending school.

School safety: It has come to my attention that some children are being dropped off or/are entering the school grounds at a very early stage in the mornings. Some come into the grounds as early as 8.30am. There is no supervision available at this time in the school even though some staff may be on the premises. I will be contacting parents of these children directly to ask them to ensure that their children are not present in the school until closer to 9am.

Wet mornings: Children should enter the school through the exit on the St Michael's side of the building while Junior infants can enter through their classroom doors or the door that Rooms 3 and 4 usually exit from in the afternoons. Well done to parents and children of Junior infants who have really worked hard on their independence during the last term.

School Maintenance: Improvements continue to be made to the school. Ms Munnelly's class will be getting a new carpet soon while the school have applied to the Department of Education for grants for roof works and bathroom improvements.


