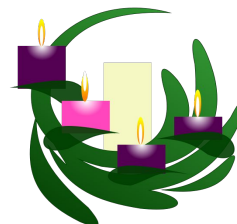
**Ms. Carmody**, our senior infants teacher also leaves us to take up an appointment back home and we also wish her well in her endeavours.

## Scoil Naomh Pádraig Latest Updates

As you all know, the long-awaited amalgamation of St Mary's and St Michael's will officially begin on the 1st September 2026. This marks the culmination of a significant body of work, including, extensive consultation with the school community and key decisions making made at every level — the schools themselves, the Boards of Management, the Department of Education, Parish, and our Patron, Bishop Deenihan. I am delighted at the opportunity to be the first Principal of Scoil Naomh Pádraig and I will work together with the whole school community to ensure that the new school is a great success.

I have been working with our Chairperson Liz Sheridan and our Deputy Principal, Ms Clódagh Daly on some aspects of the new school.

**Uniform:** We had focus group meeting which was very constructive, where all aspects of the new uniform were discussed. The focus group discussed preferred styles and practicalities. The importance of gathering feedback from parents and staff was agreed, with a survey to be circulated in early January to inform decision-making and ensure the uniform reflects the needs of the whole school community.

**School Logo/Crest:** Thank you for all your contributions with regard to the school Crest. Many different designs were received and analysed. We hope to make decision on this in the New Year so that it is timed with the announcement of the new uniform.

**Admissions:** Our enrolment for Junior infants has closed but we have space to enrol more pupils as families still continue to come into the area. Please let anyone know that they need to contact the school in order to secure their school place. Please contact St Michael's with regard to admissions to our special classes for Autism.

**Child Protection:** Scoil Naomh Pádraig is compliant with all aspects of child protection and we have commenced the vetting process for all staff before the school opens in September. All existing staff of St Mary's and St Michael's have to be vetted in the New Year to comply with the procedures. **Grant Aid.** I have asked the Department of Education for possible grant aid for Information Technology, sanitary facilities, and roof improvements so that we can get off to the best possible start in terms of our physical environment.

**Discussion and Engagement:** Over the next six months I will be engaging with all the stakeholders around decisions regarding the new school. There is considerable talent and expertise across the two school communities and they will be consulted on all issues so that the best balanced approach can be reached before the opening of the new school in the Autumn. I look forward to the many opportunities for debate leading into key decisions to be made in the coming months.

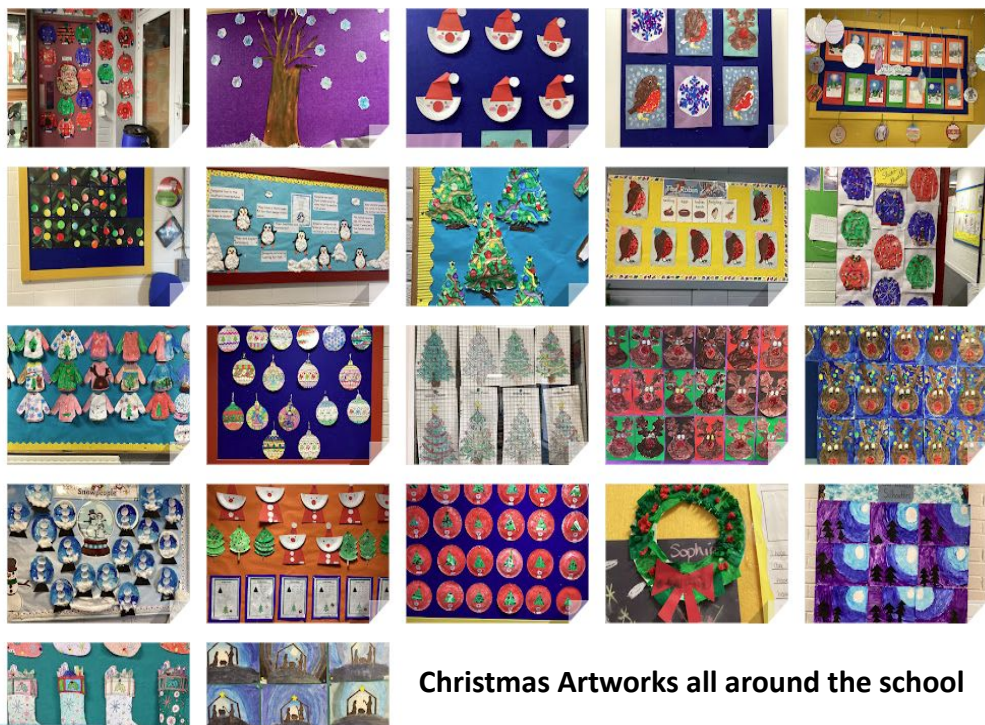
## Annual Santa Dance n' Dash Event Today!

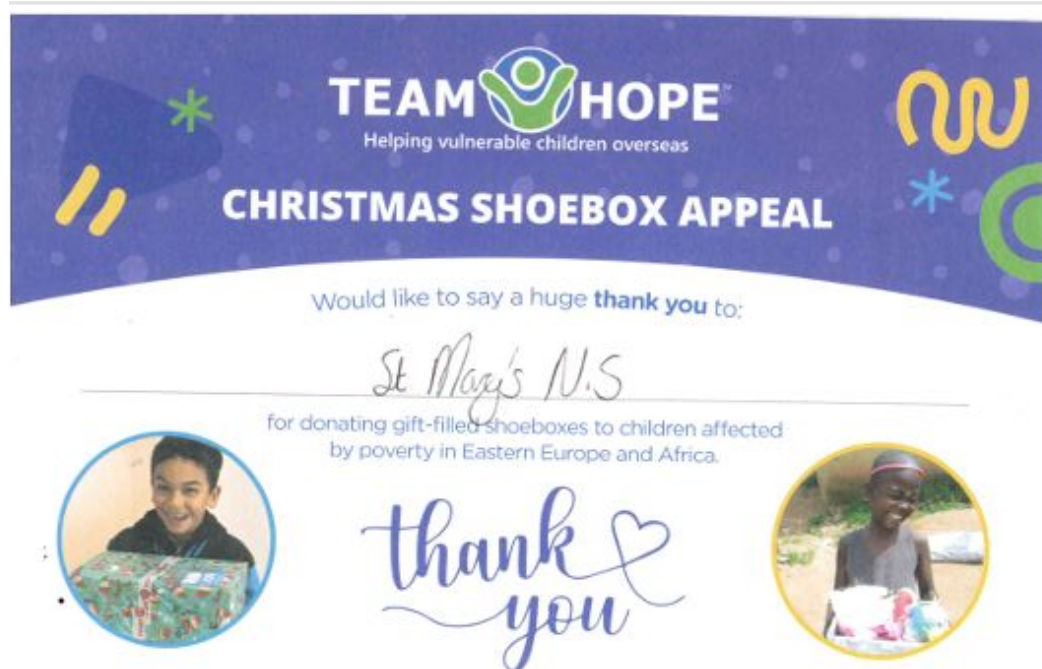

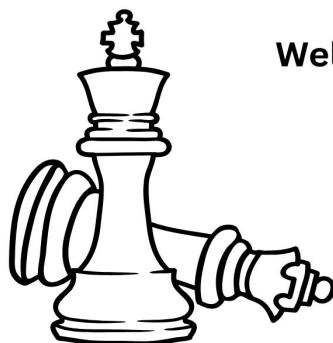
